

Revelation 21:1-6 Heaven is Your Home (Part 1) Sunday, 2/11/18 – Pastor Stuart Fraser

I.	Introduction: John sees a vision of the New Jerusalem coming down out of heaven onto a
	newly created Earth, where God lives together with mankind in perfection and harmony.

II. Heaven is Your Home (Rev 21:1-6).

- A. The Creation of the New Heaven (v. 1).
 - 1. God will create a new universe and earth, after He has destroyed our sin cursed reality. This new realm will have no sea and will have a new capitol city.
- B. The Capitol of the New Heaven (v. 2).
 - 1. The new Jerusalem is not heaven, it is the capitol city of the eternal state. It is the central gathering place where believers come to meet with God and others.
- C. The Creator in the New Heaven (v. 3)
 - 1. God once again dwells among His people as He did in the garden with Adam and Eve, because Jesus has destroyed sin, the barrier that separated God and man.
- D. The Changes in the New Heaven (vv. 4-6).
 - 1. The quality of life in heaven will be more enjoyable than anything we have ever experienced; there will be a perfect sense of community, love, health, and joy.

III Conclusion: God will create a totally new earth and a new universe, where He eliminates sin, death, and the curse forever. Everything about this new reality will be greater.

Questions About: Heaven is Your Home

- 1. What do you think of when you contemplate heaven? Do you think of floating clouds? Angels playing harps? Peter at the pearly gates? A white-haired man on a throne? Streets of gold?
- 2. What did Paul say about heaven? (**Phil 1:21, 23**) Is heaven *so* good that dying is better than living? How is heaven our home? (**2 Cor 5:8**) How had Paul experienced it? (**2 Cor 12:1-4**)
- 3. How will God uncreate the universe at the end of time? (Rev 20:11; 21:1; 2 Peter 3:10-13) Why does He destroy our physical reality? (Gen 3:17; Rom 8:18-22) What does He create?
- 4. What does John see coming down out of heaven? (v. 2) What is the metaphor that John uses to describe it? How was this city specially designed? (John 14:1-4; Heb 11:10; 12:22-23)
- 5. What is the greatest feature of this new reality? (v. 3) How is heaven a restoration of the Garden of Eden? (Gen 2-3) How does God's presence make heaven even greater?
- 6. What are some differences from our reality and the new reality? (**Rev 21:4-6**) How will God comfort us in heaven? (**v. 4**) Does this mean there will be crying in heaven? Why or why not?
- 7. How has Jesus dismantled sorrow, pain, and death? (Is 53:4; 1 Cor 15:54-55; Heb 2:14; Rev 20:10, 14) How have the "first things passed away"? (v. 4) How is that comforting to you?
- 8. What does it mean that "all things [are] new"? (Rev 21:5-6) What does Jesus offer to those who want it? (v. 6) What does water represent? (Isa 55:1; John 4:10; 13-14; 10:10)
