

**I. Introduction: Paul commanded the Corinthians to glorify God in every aspect of their lives, whether it was something grand, or something as simple as eating or drinking.**

- A. God created man to glorify Himself, and that is his purpose in this life. When we honor God with our lives, it is the ultimate form of worship for our Creator.

**II. Do All To The Glory of God (1 Cor 10:23-11:1).**

A. Edification Glorifies God (**10:23-24**).

1. Paul instructed the Corinthians to consider limiting their liberty in Christ if their actions might hurt their fellow believers, rather than build up their faith.

B. Enjoyment Glorifies God (**10:25-27**).

1. Paul told the Corinthians not to ask questions about meat bought in the market, and not to ask a host about meat offered to them, but to enjoy it as from the Lord.

C. Empathy Glorifies God (**10:27-30**).

1. Paul told the Christians not to object to what was offered to them at an unbeliever's meal unless a weaker brother at the table objected to eating it.

D. Exaltation Glorifies God (**10:31-11:1**).

1. Paul exhorted the Corinthians to do everything in life to God's glory, and not to do anything that would hinder their ability to preach the Gospel to unbelievers.

**III. Conclusion: Christian liberties should be something we worship God for, but we should never worship our liberties or they will become a stumbling block to others.**

## Questions About: Do All To The Glory of God

1. What is the purpose of life? What does God say is the purpose of life? (**Col 1:15-16**) How does honoring God bring glory to Him? How is obedience a way of worshipping Him?
2. What did Paul mean that “all things are lawful”? (**1 Cor 10:23-24**) If everything is lawful why should a person limit their liberty? (**v. 23**) What does it mean to edify? What things edify?
3. What was Paul’s primary concern with liberties? (**1 Cor 10:23-24**) What command did he give to the Corinthians? (**v. 24**) How does caring for our neighbor glorify God? (**Matt 22:36-40**)
4. What did Paul tell the Corinthians about meat sacrificed to idols? (**1 Cor 10:25-27**) What was Paul’s reason for saying this? (**v. 26**) How can our enjoyment of liberties glorify God?
5. What did Paul reiterate about a weaker brother being at a meal with meat sacrificed to idols? (**1 Cor 10:27-30**) How does care and concern for our fellow brother or sister glorify God?
6. What was Paul’s main point in this passage? (**1 Cor 10:31-11:1**) What should be the primary motivation for everything we do? How should the glory of God affect every area of life?
7. Why did Paul tell them to imitate him? (**1 Cor 11:1**) Who was Paul imitating? How did Jesus live for the glory of God? (**John 4:34; 5:30; 17:4**) How did Jesus sacrifice for God’s glory?
8. Why do you read your Bible? Love your spouse? Serve your family? Go to work? Go fishing? Eat food? Serve others? Help the church? Play sports? Do you do it for God’s glory or yours?

### Prayer

1. Ask God to help you live for His glory in everything that you do.
2. Ask God to show you areas where you can better demonstrate His glory to unbelievers.
