

**I. Introduction: Psalm 19 deals with God's perfect revelation, given to man through the general revelation of creation, and the special revelation of His word and His Son.**

- A. There are three witnesses of God: His creation reveals His power and wisdom; His law reveals His holiness and justice; His Son reveals His grace and truth.

**II. The Perfect Revelation of God (Psalm 19:1-14).**

A. God the Creator (**vv. 1-6**).

1. The clear and consistent testimony of the universe is that God is the creator. The witness of the cosmos is that He is powerful, wise, and all glorious.

B. God the Lawgiver (**vv. 7-9**).

1. The moral law of God is perfect, and like the sun, the law of God is the dominant feature of God's revelation. It reveals His holiness, justice, and goodness.

C. God the Redeemer (**vv. 10-14**).

1. David's personal reaction to God's law was to proclaim its value and preciousness to him, and to pray for God's cleansing and acceptance as his rock and redeemer.

**III. Conclusion: David's psalm praises God for being the creator, law-giver, and redeemer. After contemplating God's world and God's word he is struck by his need for a Savior.**

## Questions About: The Perfect Revelation of God

1. When you think about God, what is the first thought you have? Is He harsh? Cold? Distant? Or is He good? Kind? Wise? Powerful? How does your thinking about God shape your life?
2. What does the Bible say about the person who does not believe in God? (**Psa 14:1**) Why does God harshly condemn atheists? (**Rom 1:18-20**) What does this say about them?
3. How does David say that the creation reveals God? (**Psa 19:1-6**) How big is your God? Is He as big as the universe? What fascinates David about the creation? (**vv. 4-6**) Why?
4. How does David say the character of God is revealed in the Scriptures? (**Psa 19:7-9**) How is the creation the general revelation of God and the Bible His special revelation? (**Psa 19:7-9**)
5. What are the six titles that he uses to describe the Bible? What are the six characteristics of the Word? What are the six benefits of Scripture? What does it reveal to you about the Bible?
6. What was David's response to the revelation of God? (**Psa 19:10-14**) How did David value the Bible? (**v. 10**) How do you value your Bible? Who wrote it, David or God?
7. Why did the revelation of God cause David to pray for forgiveness? (**Psa 19:10-14**) What did David pray about his own sin? (**vv. 12-13**) What does this teach you about sin in your life?
8. How is God revealed at the end of this Psalm? (**Psa 19:14**) How is God a redeemer that saves? (**Job 19:25; Titus 2:12-14; 1 Peter 1:18-29**) What do you need God to redeem?

### Prayer

1. Will you ask God to show you if there are any sins in your life?
2. Will you ask God to forgive you and lead you in the path of righteousness?
